## Probing the Passage

### John's Witness:

- Even as a child, people are talking about John.
- God used the \_\_\_\_\_ of his birth to put the spotlight on him.
- The name scandal, the healing, all serve to get people thinking about him.

### Proclamation:

- Zechariah makes a huge proclamation.
  - ◊ He says a mighty savior has been raised up.
    - ⇒ And Jesus is still a baby.
  - ◊ He says they have been saved from their enemies.
    - ⇒ And Rome is still there.

### This is a Prayer:

- Might we have this same prayer?
- Note what he doesn't pray for:
  - ◊ Monetary Wealth
  - ◊ Vague Blessing
- He prays that we might become the sort of people who serve God in holiness and righteousness.

### What Do You Want of God?

- We want to be in a place where our fervent prayer isn't just for the goodies that God can provide.
- We want to be in a place where our prayer is that he \_\_\_\_\_ us to be the sort of people who joyfully and righteously serve Him.

### Dawn is Knowledge:

- And John (and We) are called to bring it!
- We bring knowledge of Salvation.
- You don't have to \_\_\_\_\_ in \_\_\_\_\_ anymore.

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**We Have Built This Up:**

- The Coming King
- The Fulfillment of the Promise
- Dawn is Breaking
- The Inflection Point of History

**And the World Doesn't Care:**

- In a somewhat smelly room, a mother gives birth alone.
- She isn't surrounded by family and loved ones. Her parents aren't sitting outside the hospital room.
- There is no mention of a doctor or midwife to ensure that this goes right.
- We can't spare a room for the mother.
- We can't spare a crib for the baby.
- The night likely wasn't clean and silent.
- It was more likely to be \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_.

**How God Chose to Appear:**

- We recall God can do what he \_\_\_\_\_.
- God could have arranged to be born in Herod's palace, or with the priests of Jerusalem.
- He could have arranged to have loved ones celebrating his arrival, like John had.
- Instead he chose this...

**One Reason:**

- In Jesus' birth, he smashed himself against the worst parts of \_\_\_\_\_.
  - ◇ The rejection his parents encountered.
  - ◇ The disregard for the poor.
  - ◇ Being pushed around by forces outside of your control.

**Let Us Approach Him:**

- With our loneliness, tiredness and fatigue.
- With our inability to see the future.
- With the grime that we find ourselves in.
- And more importantly, with the dirt and grime inside ourselves.

**Because He Redeems Them:**

- He will never leave you, nor forsake you.
- He holds the future in His hands.
- We serve a God who is making everything new.
- He redeems us.

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
