

super glue has peeled off. So that is a big praise. We are continuing to be grateful for the surgeon's skills in removing his six inch gall bladder with olive size gall stones. Ruth now has copies of the surgery photos as proof!

Once John finished the process for Career Guidance, the analysis of his tests showed that the jobs he has been doing over the years are what God made him for. He has been offered a position as a

web developer in the Language Software Department at our Dallas Center.

After setting aside funds for some time, we were ready to replace Ruth's 18 year old clunker. As a ministry, a coworker at the Wycliffe Center maintains his Toyota dealer's license.
