





Dear FTPC Family,

During most months, we hold a Testimony Sunday, where we have space for people to come forward and share what the Lord has and is doing in our lives. This is an opportunity for the church to be built up alongside one another. And it is important that we do this. But it is also important that we pay attention to what the Lord has done over the course of the whole year. I invite you to reflect with me as we think on some of the ways that Jesus has been glorified in 2023.

Honored in Intentional Discipleship: We are a church that is taking active and intentional steps to grow in our relationship to Jesus. I am constantly grateful at how many of you choose to not only attend church services on Sunday, but also take part in Bible studies, prayer groups, service opportunities, and other small groups as the Lord leads.

Honored in Building Use: With the birth of God Salvation New Living Church (the congregation that meets on Saturdays), and the move for Grace Point Community Church to meet in the building, Jesus is honored in the stewardship of the church building. It is incredible to realize that there is some form of worship, Bible Study, Prayer, or meeting that is regularly scheduled for every day of the week other than Friday. And that is in addition to all of the more informal meetings, fellowship counseling, and prayer that also occurs here.

Honored in Preferring One Another: A charge given to early Christians is that they are called to "outdo one another in showing honor". We see that here, in our individual interactions with one another and in the different congregations striving to navigate a shared building. This can sound simple, but it is a profound demonstration of the difference that the Gospel makes. Every time that you navigate a disagreement with someone in the church and choose to love, honor, and build peace with them, you are serving as a witness to the power of Jesus.

Honored in Service: I continue to be thankful and grateful for how many people choose to dedicate their gifts, talents, and in some cases, simply dedicate their willing hands to service. As we hold memorials, retreats, cleaning initiatives, and potlucks, you can see the Lord's pleasure as his people choose to go about doing his work.

Honored in Presence/Worship: And even as we have had the opportunity to actively do things in 2023, it has also been good to see people resolve to simply being with the Lord. This is mostly manifested in ways that are not programmed, as so much of relationship is not programmed. I particularly think of the frequent times that believers steal away to spend time in silent prayer with their Father.





Eepruarx: The Larkins, Wxsliffe Bible Translators

THE PROJECT

The Panao Quechua language community celebrated

the completion of their New Testament in 2010 and now these 100,000 people are hungry for God's full revelation! The translation of the Old Testament into their language is underway. Alex Larkin's role is to help guide the Panao Quechua team through the process. He empowers them to engage with the Scriptures in new ways.

Alex is married to Patricia Arevalo Villegas de Larkin. Patty is studying linguistics to become a Literacy and

Education Specialist with SIL, Wycliffe's partner organization. This will allow her to use her gifting in childhood education to further heart transformation through the use of the translated Scriptures.



Halfway through college I had a crisis and dropped out of school for a year while I went through counseling

and sought healing. That year was full of darkness and depression, but my faith kept me alive, kept me going. I anchored myself in the Word, where I was reassured of God's promises to me. I worshiped with others on Sundays and Wednesdays. These songs based on Scripture- reminded me of God's love for me. He carried me through that year. I came out of the valley with a


deeper faith and a newfound resolution to share Christ's hope with those that don't know him yet.

At about that time I had completed six years of intense formal Spanish study, with tutors and immersion experiences. I could now read my Bible in a second language and took pride in the fact that I read it exclusively in Spanish for the better part of a year. But then I realized that even though I was understanding what I read, it was just head knowledge. It wasn't impacting my heart, and it wasn't changing my

life. Rereading the same passages in English -my heart language- took the message from my head to

my heart, where it impacted and transformed me.

Later I learned that there are over 7,000 languages in the world, and over 1.5 billion people for whom no complete Bible translation exists. Remembering how my Spanish Bible rarely ever impacted me, I thought about the countless young children who have to drop out of school in the second grade to help the family farm. And them? How will they come to know Jesus? Everyone needs to



know this Man!

I began talking with Wycliffe Bible Translators, as their mission is to translate God's Word so that everyone can hear or read it in a language that speaks to their hearts. I decided to join. Through the generosity of many, God provided for me to get a Master's in Applied Linguistics and Exegesis, graduating in 2016.

> Then he provided a Quechua family that adopted me as one of their own in 2017.

> God then provided the ministry team and funding I needed to start my Wycliffe Ministry in Peru.

> In 2018 I moved to Peru and started language and culture learning. In 2019 I met Patty, the love of my life. We got married in 2021.



ABOUT PATTY LARKIN:

My family is full of teachers and as a girl I came to love books and learning. I also love learning languages. My first language is Spanish, but I also speak English, Portuguese and a bit of Quechua. In 2015 I started visiting the Andes Mountains with my church. The tenacity of the Quechua in the face of limited resources impressed me. Yet as I saw the reality of the Quechua children, I was impacted by the



shortcomings in their school system, their lack of life opportunities, and the barriers they faced in knowing their Creator.

I studied educational psychology at Champagnat University. When the director of a Quechua ministry invited me to do my internship with them, I accepted! God opened all the doors. During my 2019 internship, I was usually pulling out of town in a shared taxi around 5AM to go out to the Quechua villages. I spent half my time working on my internship, helping Quechua children with learning disabilities. This highlighted for me the importance of mother-tongue education. I spent the other half of my village time doing ministry with Quechua children and teens, teaching them about Jesus with the Quechua Scriptures.

It was during this year that I met Alex. I asked him to help me with a part of my thesis. We became friends, fell in love, and got married in 2021.





I am studying linguistics through SIL Curso Fundamental and CanIL to become a Literacy and Education Specialist with SIL, Wycliffe's partner organization. This will allow me to use my gifting in childhood education further heart transformation through translated Scriptures.
