

days ago when the conversation turned to the latest set of statistics bemoaning the rate at which churches are closing in this country, admittedly not a particularly pleasant topic. Later that day Valerie and I were visiting with friends whose church is at risk of becoming one of those statistics. Like our own church, they have been engaged in a pastoral search for a couple of years. But unlike FTPC, there is no clear vision of what their church is or should be or what their ministry should look like. Both conversations got me thinking about what the church really is.

That recent article on closure stats repeatedly referred to churches as "places of worship"; it was a geographic definition of the church. Sometimes we think and talk about church as a place to go. ("Where do you go to church? I go to FTPC...") While it can be helpful to talk about church in those terms, it is far from an adequate definition. The church is much more than a place.

The government has its own somewhat loose definition of what a church is. In determining whether or not an organization should qualify as a church, they might look at a number of criteria, including things like conducting regular religious services. It tends to be a definition of church that focuses on what is actually done – program or ministry activity – rather than place. That kind of criteria can be helpful as well, but again the definition is inadequate. The church is much more than a particular collection of activities or programs.

When the Bible talks about a local church, it is talking about a congregation, a gathering of God's people together. It is a definition that is less about geography and activity and more about relationship. It is God's people gathered together in relationship with their Lord and Leader and in relationship with one another. In short, the church is people. A church may have a building or no building, programs or a lack of program. But a healthy church needs to have healthy Christians living in healthy relationships with the Lord and with one another. I am thankful and blessed to serve such a church.

So next weekend, I hope you GO to church. And I hope that together we will DO church. But my heart's prayer week by week is that we will faithfully continue to BE church – God's people together in relationship with Him and with one another.

Several of those applicants, including Aaron, were interviewed multiple times and thoroughly vetted. We are delighted to tell you that we are convinced God has led us to His choice for FTPC's next pastor.

The McGruders have been a part of the FTPC family for the last few years as Aaron has moved toward pastoral ordination in ECO under Foster's sponsorship. Most of you are well acquainted with them. He preached on April 28 with a time of Q & A following. The next opportunity to hear Aaron preach is Sunday, May 5, 2019

There will be a called congregational meeting immediately following the service on May 5 for the purpose of approving the call. Assuming a positive vote, Pastor Aaron would be ready to begin in July.







It coincides annually with the important Islamic month of religious observation — Ramadan, a time of the year when Muslims are much more deeply aware of spiritual matters.

While Media sound bites about Islamic extremism can too easily incite anger, fear and even hatred towards Muslims, we seek to resist this temptation to generalize, and instead, resolve to respond and pray with the mind and heart of Christ.

Join the millions of Christians around the world, and churches and ministries from many denominations, who regularly participate in this largest ongoing prayer focus on the Muslim world. A new full-color prayer guide booklet — available each year in both adult and kids versions — is a proven tool to help Christians to understand and to persistently pray for Muslim neighbors and nations.

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER IN TUKWILA: THURSDAY, MAY 2, 2019

The National Day of Prayer was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. In 1988, the law was unanimously amended by both the House and the Senate and signed

into law by President Ronald Reagan on Thursday, May 5, 1988, designating the first Thursday of May as a day of national prayer. Every president since 1952 has signed a National Day of Prayer proclamation.

Our theme for the 2019 National Day of Prayer on May 2, 2019 is Love One Another. The theme comes from the words of Jesus in John 13:34, "Love one another. Just as I have loved you." In a time of dividedness and lack of civility, the love of Christ through the Church is a powerful testimony of the gospel.

The NDP event in Tukwila will be on *Thursday, May 2, 2019 at the Tukwila City Hall Flagpole, 6200 South-center Blvd, Tukwila, WA 98188.* Gather at 11:45 am. Prayer will begin promptly at noon. We invite you to join

with us for prayer, followed by a no host lunch 1:15 - 2:30 pm in the conference room of Friendz Café, 12930 E Marginal Way S, Tukwila, WA 98168.

Our hope is that individuals, churches, and spiritual leaders in America, will humble ourselves and unify in prevailing prayer for the next great move of God in America. We can come together in clear agreement that this is our greatest need. We can become a visible union, standing together in prayer. We can pray more than ever before, and practice extraordinary prayer for the next great move of God in America that will catapult the message of the gospel nationally and internationally.
