

The Music that You Listen to Matters

The deliverance of the Israelites from the nation of Egypt in the book of Exodus is one of the crowning examples of God's glory being shown in the Biblical narrative. Egypt is subjected to plagues, and eventually the army of Egypt is covered by the Red Sea. And at the end, as Israel contemplates what the Lord has done, the Israelites break out on in song. Exodus 15 is a song of praise to the Lord where Israel extols both who the Lord is (My strength, My Defense, My Salvation, My God, My Father's God...) and what the Lord has done: hurling Pharoah's army into the sea and shattering the enemy. And these tasks, proclaiming specifically what the Lord has done, and proclaiming who the Lord is, are incredibly important in worship.

When you sing songs of praise, you are engraving theology on your heart. You are making concepts and truths more and more familiar and real to you. This is a good that happens in the moment, and it is also a means of preparing oneself for the trials to come. Effectively, the music that you sing forms and molds you. If the words that you listen to, and sing, are shaping you, then it makes all the sense in the world to think seriously about the molds that you are using.

One song that we have used in Worship at church is "Grace Alone" by Dustin Kensrue. It presents a simple Gospel message as an expression of both praise and confession.

"I was an orphan lost at the fall...
(The Father) predestined to adopt me as Your own...
(Jesus), You left your home to seek out the lost...
Lord, you died that I might reap what you have sown
And you rose that I might be a new creation...
(The Holy Spirit) called us into a kingdom that cannot be shaken"

As the Gospel message is being sung, it also takes specific care to praise the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, focusing particularly on the sovereignty of the Father, the salvific work of the Son, and the calling nature of the Spirit. In singing this song, week in and week out, we are uniting our mind, body, and soul in the recognition of who we are, the proclamation of who God is (both God's work and God's attributes), and what the Father, Son, and Spirit have done. Songs like this point to being molded and shaped along the liens of what is most true, and cause the singer to be drawn into worship of who God truly is.

Conversely, last year, Natalie Grant and Cory Asbury covered the song "You Will be Found". The song certainly presents an uplifting message and calls out the need for a savior, saving:

"Have you ever felt like you could disappear? Like you could fall, and no one would hear? Well, let that lonely feeling wash away Maybe there's a reason to believe you'll be okay 'Cause when you don't feel strong enough to stand You can reach, reach out your hand"

Lisa Pak – General Session 1, Friday Night at 7 pm



Dr. Lisa Pak currently works alongside Rick Warren on the Finishing the Task (FTT) lead team. Her previous experience includes serving as the Regional Director for Ontario and Nunavut at the Canadian Bible Society, in addition to over a decade of pastoral ministry and church experience

in the United States, South Korea, Singapore and Canada with a particular focus on diaspora peoples, global missions, and the rising generations. She is a second-generation Korean Canadian and Toronto native, ordained by the Korean Association of Independent Churches and Missions (KAICAM). She holds a MDiv and a MABL from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary and has earned her Doctor of Ministry in Leadership at Tyndale Seminary. Lisa has travelled globally and is passionate about all diaspora communities and mobilizing the church, parachurch, women, and the young generation altogether in collaboration to share the good news of Jesus Christ with all who have yet to hear.

Sam George – General Session 3, Saturday at 4:30 pm



Sam George, PhD, is the director of the Global Diaspora Institute at Wheaton College Billy Graham Center and serves as a global catalyst of the Lausanne Movement. He researches and teaches global migration, diaspora missions, and World Christianity in several countries across Asia, Africa, and

the Americas. The word 'diaspora' refers to the movements of people throughout the world, both voluntary and involuntary.

He holds degrees in Mechanical Engineering, Business Management, Practical Theology, and World Christianity. He worked in the technology industry for a decade before shifting to Christian ministries. He is of Asian Indian origin (Andaman Islands) and has lived in five countries, and now makes his home in the northern suburbs of Chicago. Sam is the author/editor of a dozen books, including a recent three-volume series on Asian Diaspora Christianity.

Dr. George notes, "more people are on the move today than at any time in human history and are reshaping societies economies, nations, and churches. If we continue to stay in our homogenous bubbles as the Body of Christ, we will miss out on what God wants to do in and through us today."

The Longest Night is an observance in the Advent Season marking the longest night of the year. On this day some churches in Western Christian denominations hold a service that honors people that have lost loved ones and are going through grief. Holy Communion is traditionally taken.

This service is usually held on or around the longest night of the year, which falls this year on December 21, the Winter Solstice. There is an interesting convergence for this day as it is also the feast day for Saint Thomas the Apostle. This linkage invites making some connections between Saint Thomas's struggle to believe in Jesus' resurrection, the long nights just before Christmas, and the struggle with darkness and grief faced by those living with loss.

Included in the service is a time for expression of grief and pain as well as a focus on the promise of hope.

Join us at 7:00 pm on December 21, 2023 as we at FTPC incorporate this unique service into our Advent celebration.


December Missions: Genesis Project

The Genesis Project is a Seattle-based registered 501(c)3 non-profit organization that exists to offer hope for a new life to young women and girls involved in commercial sexual

exploitation (CSE), prostitution, and sex trafficking. The mission of the Genesis Project is to provide needed services to survivors of CSE and sex trafficking in a three phase approach including immediate shelter, education, job skills training, and long-term safe houses. Ultimately, this love, support, and care will draw women toward a future of hope.

Our Drop-in Day Center is dedicated to serving female survivors of prostitution and sex trafficking. We do this with a small team of dedicated case managers and with the help of volunteers, law enforcement officers, state legislators, churches, community groups, FBI

task forces, and international partner organizations.



Release: Referrals to Safe Housing

We support survivors by offering housing resources, connections to housing programs, transportation to residential housing

(short and long term), and ongoing support. We hope to have our own long term program for survivors one day.

Drop-In Center:

The Drop-in Center is open Monday-Friday from 10am - 4pm. If you or someone you know is thinking about leaving "the life", call our drop-in center or text the survivor hotline. You can meet with one of our case managers for a cup of coffee, support, and help creating an action plan. We can help you housing, job skills, clothing, hygiene products, life skills, counseling and substance abuse referrals, and much more.

OUR THREE PHASE APPROACH


The Genesis Project uses a three phase approach to address the complex needs of a survivor of sex trafficking.

Rescue: Meeting a Survivor's Immediate Needs

Victims come to our center in many ways. Some women and girls come to The Genesis Project center through referrals from other survivors. Many young women are referred and even transported to our center by local police or the FBI Child Exploitation Task Force.

Restore: Supporting Survivor Education and Rehabilitation

The Genesis Project provides counseling, substance abuse support, job and life skills classes, paid internship opportunities, transportation to medical appointments and court, free legal counsel, and access to educational programs such as GED completion.

And for a secular song, this is fine, and significantly less offensive than other songs. In fact, the virality of the song is an incredibly useful indicator of what the world is clamoring for. But, when sung as a song of praise, when played on Christian Radio stations, It is doing something different. This song was part of the play Dear Evan Hansen, which went on to win six Tony Awards. "You Will Be Found", as a song, is written as the title character's lie to his entire school, where he claims to have cared for a student that he did not. Furthermore, when using this song as a depiction of the Lord's love for us, we quickly run into problems. For, the responsibility is placed upon the one who is hurt and suffering to reach out your hand, which is not what the Lord did with the Israelites in Egypt, nor what Jesus did with you on the

cross. And while the song makes it clear that some people need someone ("A reason to believe") there is nothing here that specifies that the one who we need is Jesus. In fact, because it was written as a lie, the tendency of the song is that you need anyone to care, rather than a particular need for the Jesus as the one who is both fully God and capable of solving your problems, and fully man and one who chose to enter into your problems.

I hope and pray that throughout the week, you are singing songs of praise and worship to the Lord. And I hope that as you do so, you continue to be discerning in the songs that are sung, paying attention to what they say about God, and considering if the lyrics are true. The songs that you listen to, and the songs that you sing are shaping you.




