In 1970, forty students at Princeton Theological Seminary were selected for a study. These were bright young individuals who were driven to enter ministry, had excel-

lent grades through most of their scholastic career and likely took their faith seriously. These students were (individually) asked to give a 3-5 minute talk on one of two subjects, either "What jobs or professions do seminary students enjoy most?" or asked to speak on the parable of the Good Samaritan. An assistant would then come in and tell the student that they were in the wrong building for the talk. The assistant would then tell the student where they should go, but gave different amounts of emphasis on how quickly the students should get there, with some being told they were already late and others being told they had plenty of time. This split the students into six groups as shown below.

As the students set off, each student came across a researcher, who acted as a "victim". "The victim was sitting slumped in a doorway, head down, eyes closed, not moving. As the (student) went by, the victim coughed twice and groaned, keeping his head down." The victim then rated the student's help offered on a o-5 scale (o is the student didn't even notice him. 5 is student not only helped him but took him to coffee or the hospital). The researchers found that the talk that students were prepared to give was not statistically relevant. What was very relevant was how hurried the participants were. Students who were in a hurry were astonishingly less likely to help the victim.

This study shows what many of us know in our lived lives. If I am at rest, I am likely to respond in a Christ-like manner to the things that come up. If I place myself under stress, real or imagined, that likelihood drops.

This study is a warning, not to stuff our lives so full of meetings, tasks, or jobs that we fail to pay attention to what is happening in front of us. When we pack our lives full of "busyness", it is important to think through what we are doing and why. Jesus took breaks, he waited on the Father; he is found constantly relying on the provision of the Father to fulfill his present clear needs. Our God is good and has promised again and again to "fully satisfy every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:19). So, as we look at our schedules for the months of September and October, as we plan our weeks and our months, include, as a priority, cycles of rest, time to get alone with God, and avoid a high-hurry environment.

Pastor George ministers around the world in music and sharing his deep faith in


es in the former USSR.



## **FTPC Missions: Tukwila Pantry**

#### **Mission Statement**

The Tukwila Pantry is a non-profit food bank established to serve the residents of the city of Tukwila, SeaTac and Burien in a humane and dignified way with their food and other referral needs. The Tukwila Pantry is committed to provide food for those in need and educate the community on issues surrounding hunger. The Pantry truck picks up food each week from Northwest Harvest and Food Lifeline. Even with these generous donations, the Pantry also needs cash donations for transporting food, equipment maintenance, utilities, and staff.

The patrons of the Tukwila Pantry are your neighbors. You may live in a different suburb, or community, but you visit Tukwila and SeaTac when you fly to Seattle, or visit

#### **Our Story**

South King County has many families, with children, living in poverty. At Cascade View Elementary School, just two blocks from the Tukwila Pantry, over 80% of the students qualify for free and reduced lunch programs.

Seeing the need, three organizations; Tukwila Rotary, The Riverton Park United Methodist Church and the Tukwila School District,

joined together to help. With an \$18,000 start-up grant from United Way, the Tukwila Pantry opened in May, 2001.

In our first year we distributed 28,101 pounds of food to 952 individuals and served 277 families. Thanks to growing awareness and partnerships, in 2017 we were able to distribute 1 million pounds of food to serve over 30,000 individuals in over 10,000 families from the communities of Tukwila, SeaTac, and Burien.

The Tukwila Pantry distributes nutritious food to our clients. We pick up food from local companies like Safeway, Cash & Carry, Del Monte, Franz Bakery, LSG Sky Chef, Starbucks, Target and more.


